



CASA SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT

As a parent and/or spectator:

1. I will not force my child to participate in sport.
2. I will remember that the purpose of our sport/league is for the children, not adults.
3. I will alert the coach of any ailment, disability that may affect the safety of my child or the safety of others.
4. I will do my best to learn the rules of the game.
5. I (and my guests) will not engage in any unsportsmanlike conduct towards officials, players, parents, before, during, and after games and practices (e.g., taunting, booing, bullying, criticism, improper language or gestures, etc.)
6. I will teach my child to play by the rules and to resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility or violence.
7. I will demand that my child treats other players, coaches, officials and spectators with respect, regardless of race, color, creed, gender, or ability.
8. I will teach my child that doing one's best is more important than winning, so that my child will not feel defeated by the outcome of the game or his/her performance.
9. I will not yell or ridicule my child or other participants for making a mistake or losing a competition.
10. I agree not to criticize, belittle, antagonize, berate, or otherwise incite the officials, opposing team, its players, its coaches, or parent spectators by word or mouth or gestures.
11. I will respect the officials and their authority during games. I will not question, discuss, or confront a coach at the game/field and will discuss items at an appropriate, agreed upon time.
12. I will avoid coaching my child during the game/practices unless I am a volunteer, assistant, or head coach.
13. I agree that if I fail to abide by the CASA spectator guidelines, the CASA on-site administrator or Head of Officiating, will initiate the appropriate disciplinary action that could include, but not limited to:
 - a. Verbal warning by official, coach, or administrator
 - b. Game day ejection from facility
 - c. Parental suspension for additional games or for entire season with CASA Board approval based on written assessment of incident
 - d. Law enforcement involvement/arrest
